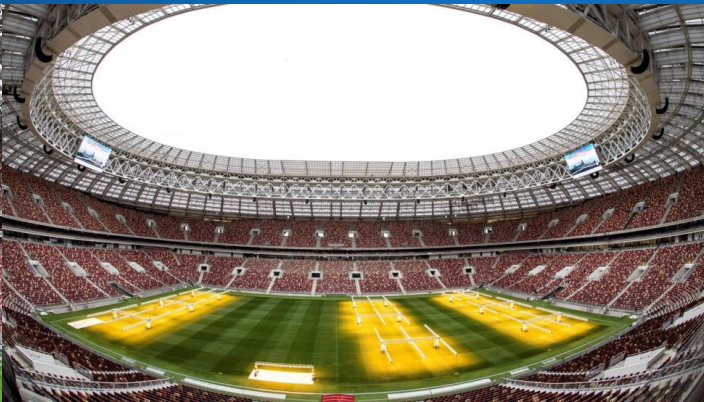

Luzhniki Stadium, Moscow

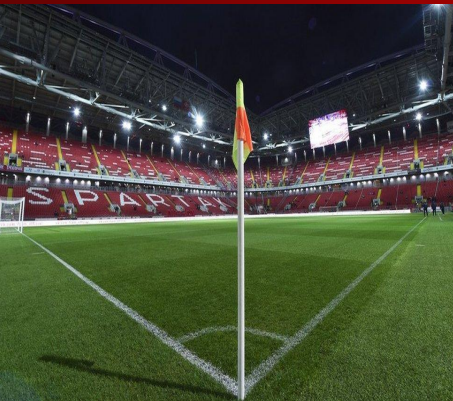
The capacity of this stadium is 81,006. The stadium opened in 1956. The location is in Russia's Capital city. The matches played in this stadium were Russia vs Saudi Arabia, Germany v Mexico, Portugal v Morocco, Denmark v France.

The World Cup Finals were played here.



Spartak Stadium, Moscow

The capacity of this stadium is 43,298. The Stadium opened in 2014. This stadium is located in North west Moscow. The matches played in this stadium were Argentina v Iceland, Poland v Senegal, Belgium v Tunisia, Serbia v Brazil.



Nizhny Novgorod Stadium, Nizhny Novgorod

The capacity of this stadium is 45,331. The stadium opened in 2018. The stadium is located in Nizhny Novgorod. The games played in this stadium were Sweden v South Korea, Argentina v Croatia, England v Panama, Switzerland v Costa Rica.



Moldova Arena, Seransk

The capacity of this stadium is 44,442. The stadium opened in 2018. This stadium is located in South east of Moscow. The matches played in this stadium were Peru v Denmark, Columbia v Japan, Panama v Tunisia.



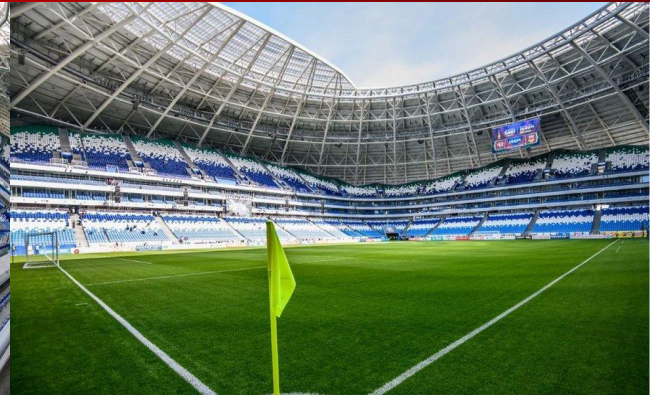
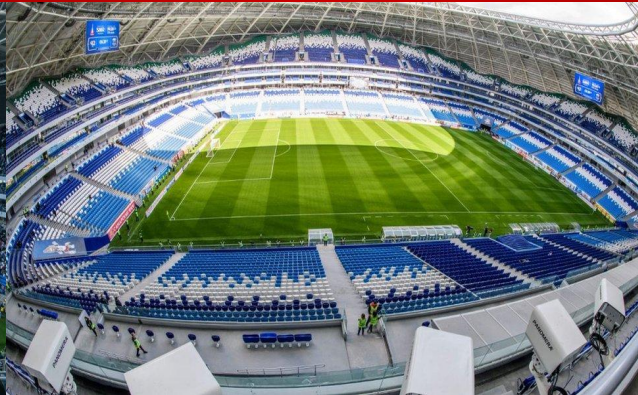
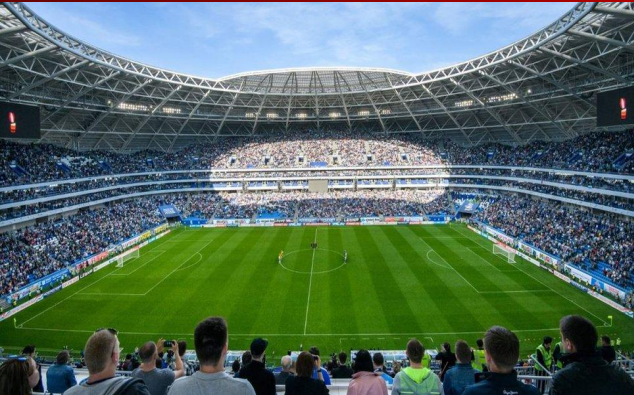
Kazan Arena, Kazan

The capacity of this stadium is 44,779. This stadium opened in 2013. This stadium is located in The capital and largest city of the Republic of Tatarstan, east of Moscow, Kazan lies at the confluence of the Volga and Kazanka rivers in European Russia. The matches played in this stadium were, France v Australia, Iran v Spain, Poland v Colombia, South Korea v Germany.



Samara Arena Samara

The capacity of this stadium is 44,807. This stadium opened in 2018. This stadium is located south-eastern part of European Russia. The matches played Rica v Serbia, Denmark v Australia, Uruguay v Russia, Senegal v Colombia.



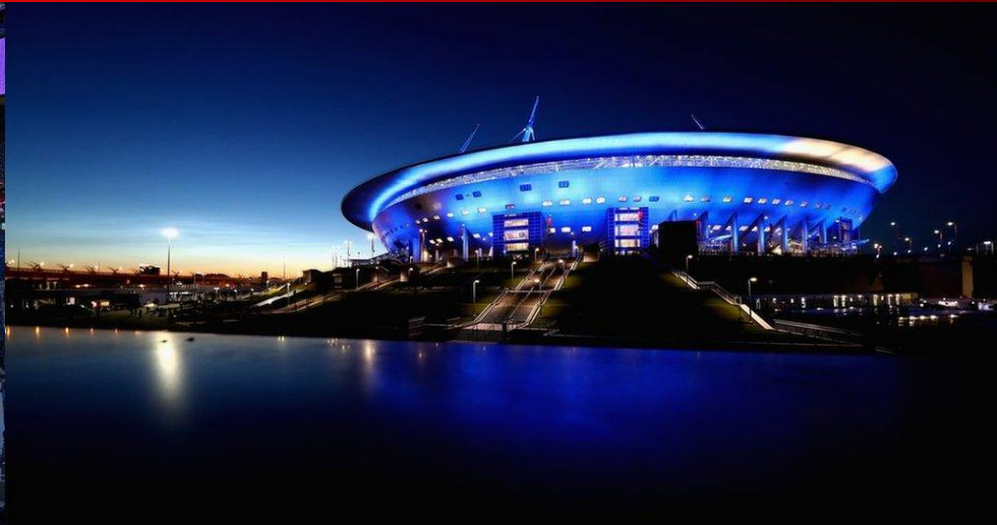
Ekaterinburg Arena, Ekaterinburg

The capacity of this stadium is 68,134. The stadium opened in 2017. This stadium is located in St. Petersburg. The matches played here were Morocco v Iran, Russia v Egypt, Brazil v Costa Rica, Nigeria v Argentina.



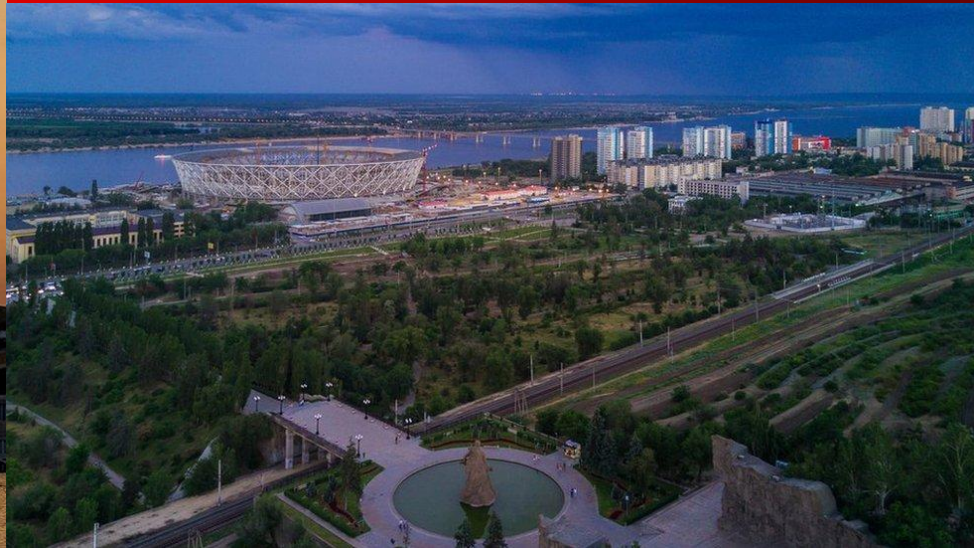
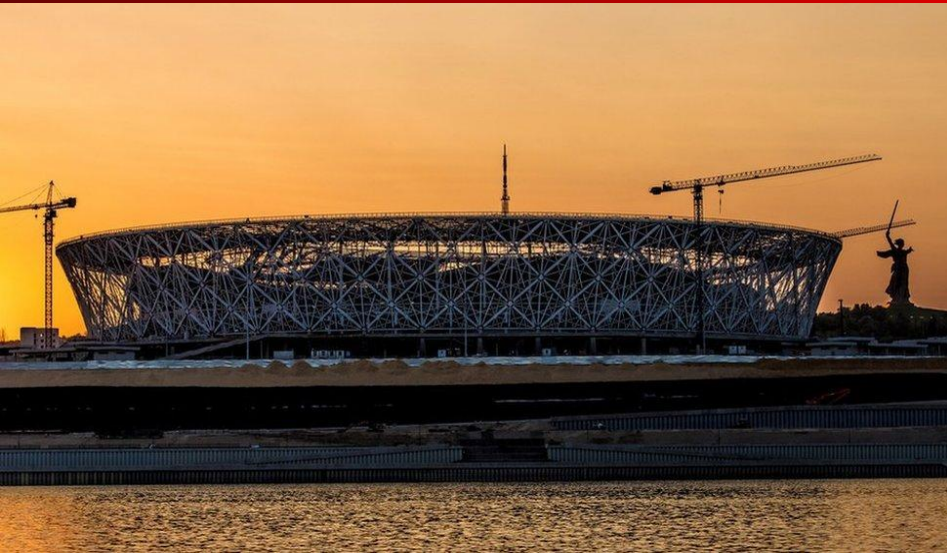
Kaliningrad Stadium, Kaliningrad

The capacity of this stadium is 35,212. The stadium opened in 2018. This stadium is located in centre of Kaliningrad. The matches played here were Croatia v Nigeria, Serbia v Switzerland, Spain v Morocco, and Spain v Morocco.



Volgograd Arena, Volgograd

The capacity of this stadium is 45,568. The stadium opened in 2018. This stadium is located in Formerly Stalingrad. The matches played here were Tunisia v England, Nigeria v Iceland, Japan v Poland Saudi Arabia v Egypt.



Rostov Arena, Rostov-on-Don

The capacity of this stadium is 45,145. This stadium opened in 2018. The location of this stadium is situated south of Moscow on the Don River, 20 miles from the Sea of Azov. The matches played here were Brazil v Switzerland, Uruguay v Saudi Arabia, South Korea v Mexico, Iceland v Croatia.



Fisht Stadium, Sochi

The capacity of this stadium is 47,700. This stadium opened in 2013. The location of this stadium is situated on the coast of the Black Sea, Sochi stretches for 140km, making it the longest city in Europe - second in the world behind Mexico City. The matches played in this stadium were, Portugal v Spain, Belgium v Panama, Germany v Sweden, Australia v Peru.

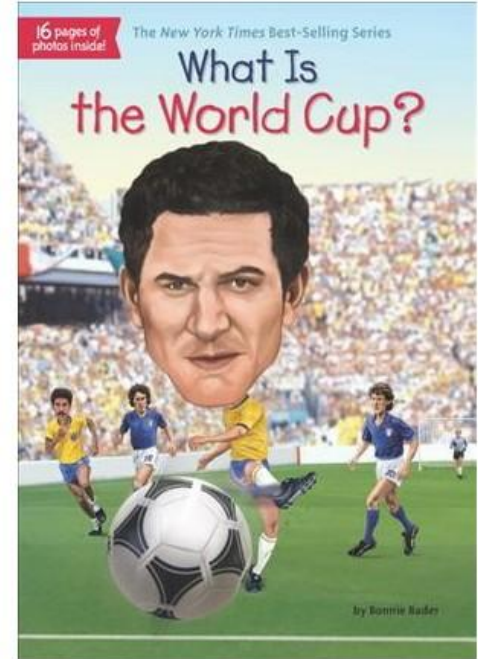
